#### **What is Cultural Competency, Why is it Important?**

\* Cultural competency is training provided to healthcare practitioners to increase their understanding of varied health related cultural beliefs, practices and diseases that effect diverse patient populations.

\* Legislative initiatives in cultural competency are being put into effect in many states requiring physicians to obtain additional certification in cultural competency. CME courses in cultural competency will prepare physicians to meet the needs of changing US demographics and eliminate healthcare disparities for patients of different cultural and ethnic background.
